# **Programme View**

Overview at how the various elements of the programmes work together



All IP and Exchange Exit – Top level programme encompassing all the aspects below

Salisbury and Mildenhall Trials – 2 exchanges used to learn about challenge and opportunities for WLR withdrawal for CPs and Openreach

**FTTP Priority Stop Sell** – Exchanges with over 75% FTTP coverage. If the premises has FTTP available, only FTTP can be ordered. From August 8 will cover 501 live exchanges, 4.6m premises

UK WLR Stop Sell – Live from 5 September 2023, WLR will no longer be available to order (with minimal exceptions)

WLR Withdrawal – WLR product will be withdrawn, and current assets must be migrated to alternative products. Withdrawal date is December 2025

**Exchange Exit** – Exchanges where all assets and equipment will be moved to alternative exchanges. 5 pilot exchanges, further 103 proposed in current consultation


# Exceptions for WLR will be available post 5 September 2023 where an equivalent journey is not yet developed

Our policy states that until an Openreach equivalent order journey is available, CPs may continue to order the WLR version. Once an Openreach All IP equivalent order journey is available, we will allow 6 months for CP consumption.








# Salisbury and Mildenhall WLR Withdrawal


## Key learning:

Reducing FTTC broadband speed to 2Mpbs had a greater impact than diverting non freephone calls to the CP for discussion on migrating. This includes action from both CP and end customers and considers all forms of engagement (such as faults raised, cease orders and migrations, both with and without request to remove measures.)

## What's next?

Have the measures been a valuable learning opportunity for CPs? What can we do as an industry to maximise on this now we are at the end of measures going live? What do we take forwards from this to 2025? Cessation is coming - is there a final push needed before October, and how can Openreach help CPs with this?

- 'FTTC measures' have had the greater impacts. Bandwidth dropped to 2mb speed profile.
- The 'measures' include diverting calls to the CPs BSIA have highlighted this to members • since alarm diallers will now do this and won't be able to communicate with the ARC.

# Notification of Stop Sell implementation Tranche 13 and Tranche 9 go live

Latest tranche updates were notified on 13 July 2023.

41 FTTP priority locations are due to go live (stop sell) on 8 August 2023

## Tranche 13

18 new FTTP priority exchanges were announced with 12 months' notice and will be activated in tranche 13 which will go live on 16 August 2024.


## 4,500 Remaining Exchanges

# The Openreach exchange exit programme has a significant impact on the portfolio of products that Openreach offer to CPs. The impact may vary depending on the specific product, location and CPs involved, but overall, it is likely to have a noticeable impact on all CPs.

In Commercial Confidence

- **Deddington closing soonest March 24**
- **Openreach investing heavily on their network.**
- Pilot is underway and progress is being made. Lessons will be shared with industry.
- Members need to be aware of the above, so we can monitor any outages / losses in alarm signalling when an exit exchange occurs.






# **Priority 103 exchange exit**

**Proposed Timeline** 







# WLR UK Stop Sell principles for 5 September 2023

Scope and key principles

# Scope:

- Stop sell rules are applied to exchanges using "exchange flags" within EMP to apply either the FTTP priority exchange stop sell rules and / or the WLR stop sell rules
- On 5 September 2023 we plan to deploy the WLR stop sell ruleset by switching all UK exchanges to WLR Stop sell = Y
- Salisbury will continue as an FTTP Priority exchange subject to that ruleset; Mildenhall will be subject to the revised UKWLR withdrawal ruleset

# Key principles:

- Premises where FTTP=Y in FTTP Priority stop sell exchange areas (YY scenario), will be under the current FTTP Priority stop sell ruleset.
- WLR Withdrawal rules will apply to all other scenarios, namely:
  - 1. Premises outside of FTTP priority exchange areas
  - 2. Premises within FTTP Priority exchange areas, but where FTTP=N
- Where Openreach hasn't yet delivered a planned equivalent All IP product variant, the WLR product variant will initially be exempt from stop sell
- 6 months will be given for CPs to consume Openreach's system releases once the equivalent All IP product variants become available
- Stop sell will be applied to the WLR product variants, once the equivalent All IP product variants have been deployed, and 6 months have elapsed for CP consumption
