ECS card



Introduction

As part of the industry's drive to raise the level of health & safety (H&S) awareness in response to Government and the Health & Safety Executive initiatives, the Electrotechnical Certification Scheme (ECS) has introduced a Health and Safety Assessment as a requirement for holding an ECS card. The card is part of the Affiliation Agreement with the Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) and is recognised by the security industry as an equivalent. The card became mandatory in February 2003 for all engineers entering Major Contractors Group (MCG) sites.

The ECS Card

The ECS card is available to installers of electronic security systems, management/supervisors, apprentices or adult trainees.

Applicants for the ECS card who are in possession of a NVQ Level 3 gained within 5 years of their application are exempt the ECS H&S assessment, other exemptions are available, visit www.jib.org.uk/ecs2.htm to see the full list of exemptions.

In addition, JIB members can apply to the JIB to become Licensed Centres to provide the assessment for their own staff. Licensed Centres will have to meet set criteria for the facilities available and have at least one invigilator attend a workshop arranged by the JIB to familiarise them with the operation of the computer based assessment. Cost

The fee for initial registration and first ECS Card is £35. This includes the issue of a card valid for three years. Reminders are sent to cardholders when their cards are due for renewal. The fee for renewal or amended cards is £15. For replacement of a lost or destroyed card, the fee is £5.
